Talk 1 - The Cold Hard Truth: The Impact of False Springs on Flowering in Native Wood Species – Jessica A. Savage
I will talk about my research on floral freezing tolerance and what it can tell us about the risks associated with false springs (warming temperatures followed by a hard freeze). This research is focused primarily on native, woody plants in Northern Minnesota.

Talk 2 - The InnovaTree™ Poplar Variety: The Good, The Bad, and the Unknown – Jeff Jackson

The Natural Resources Research Institute, Duluth, MN, uses traditional breeding techniques to develop fast-growing poplar varieties. One of their top performers, InnovaTree™, was recently patented and licensed for sale. It was rigorously tested in research plantations throughout the upper Midwest. Its fast growth and disease resistance provide value for many applications. We will discuss good and bad landscape applications for it, and what is still unknown about it.

Talk 3 - Viscoelastic Behavior of Trees and Branches Under Load - Morris Levy

This presentation focuses on the mechanical concepts that govern deformation of tissues. The participant will learn about mechanical concepts of elasticity and viscosity, and their combination to provide varying strength to biological materials. The information presented is intended to give attendees the background necessary to understand what they observe in the field.

Maddy Baroli – Climate Adaptation Specialist, Northern Institute of Applied Climate Science

As a Climate Adaptation Specialist with the Northern Institute of Applied Climate Science, Maddy supports a variety of natural resource managers through the process of climate change adaptation planning, with a special focus on urban & community forestry. Her career has focused on sustainability concerns, including leadership on family forestry, urban forestry, innovative wood products, supply-chain assurances, and standard setting. Kathryn has a B.S. in Forest Resources from the University of Minnesota. She served as Chair of the Minnesota Society of American Foresters and was appointed to the Minnesota Forest Resources Council in 2002 and 2019.

Sara Hudson – Parks and Recreation Director, City Forester, City of Ashland. WI

Sara has called the shore of Lake Superior and Ashland, WI home for nearly 20 years. She holds a BS in Natural Resource Management and Conservation Biology from UW-Stevens Point. Sara has worked for the City of Ashland since 2006, in 2010 she became the Parks and Recreation Director and in 2020 took on the role of City Forester. She loves spending her time mountain biking, skiing and exploring the outdoors with her husband, two daughters and a brittany named Maple Syrup.

Jeff Jackson – Extension Educator, University of Minnesota Extension

Jeff Jackson is an Extension Educator focused on forest ecosystem health and the Natural Resource Research Institute's hybrid poplar program. He is part of an Extension Education team that specializes in collaborative learning and social-ecological innovation. Jeff's chief area of interest is developing networks of people who work together to support the innovative use of natural resources.

Morris Levy – Associate Professor Emeritus, Biomechanics, University of Minnesota – Duluth

Dr. Levy is an expert in human biomechanics and has over 20 years of experience teaching tissue mechanics. He has conducted research in mountain biking, youth Nordic skiers, canoe portaging and running. He was the faculty director of the MMAD Lab at UMD, a setting that allows researchers from a wide range of disciplines to gather in a single space. In that setting, he collaborated on projects involving performing artists (ballet dancers and pianists).

Eric Otto – Forest Health Specialist, Minnesota Department of Natural Resources

Eric Otto works as a forest health specialist for the Minnesota DNR covering northeast Minnesota. He works on multiple insect and disease issues impacting tree and forest health in that region. He previously volunteered for the Peace Corps in Ghana working in agriculture, and has also worked seasonal forestry positions in Minnesota, Wyoming, and Maine. Eric holds a Ph.D. in plant pathology and a B.S. in forest resources, both from the University of Minnesota.

Chad M. Rigsby, Ph.D – Research Scientist, Bartlett Tree Research Laboratories – Bartlett Tree Experts

Chad joined the Bartlett Tree Research Laboratories team in 2018 and is based at The Morton Arboretum. Chad's research focuses on a variety of topics centered on trees and their management including pruning, soil, root, and pest management, tree stress, growth-defense tradeoffs, and tree planting practices. In addition to research, Chad also works with Bartlett Tree Experts arborists and other groups to educate on and implement best management practices and science-driven tree care.

Jessica A. Savage – Associate Professor, University of Minnesota – Duluth

I have been a faculty at UMD for seven years. For my research, I study seasonal changes in plant physiology with a focus on the plant vascular system. I also run a phenology-centered citizen science program called Nature's Timekeepers. I got my PhD from the University of Minnesota - St. Paul. I completed a postdoc position at Harvard University and was an independent research fellow at the Arnold Arboretum before starting as a faculty in Duluth.
